



Game Time Limits

AAA & Above:
*If the score is tied after 6 complete innings (or 7 for Juniors), play shall continue until (1) the visiting team has scored more total runs than the home team at the end of the completed inning; or (2) the home team scores the completed run in an uncompleted inning. The decision is made by the home plate umpire and only if time is still within the time limit.

Pitching Limits

For AA only: Pitchers may throw up to 30 pitches in one inning, 50 per day, regardless of age & any pitcher hitting 2 batters in an inning, must play the remainder of the inning defensively while the opposing coach pitches the rest of the inning to their batters, new pitcher to start the next inning.

For AAA only: Any pitcher hitting 3 batters must be removed from the mound for the remainder of the game.

If a pitcher reaches a pitch limit while facing a batter, they may finish that batter.

If a pitcher starts a batter within one day(s) of rest threshold, they may finish that batter and is only required to observe the day(s) of rest required for when they started that batter.

Any player who has played the position of catcher in 4 or more innings in a game is not eligible to pitch on that calendar day.

If a player delivers 41 or more pitches, they may not play the position of catcher for the remainder of that day. Exception: If a pitcher reaches 40 pitches while facing a batter, they may finish that batter and is still eligible to play catcher.
